## Wills and other documents

Do you have a will? If not, you really should make one. Please give this some serious thought and look into sorting it out as soon as you can.

Another document known as a Letter of Wishes can be an annex to your will and tells your heirs more about what you would like to happen to you and your legacy. Unlike a will, it's not binding. Your heirs can ignore it, so do make sure you put the important things in your will.

There is another document that might be helpful to produce. It contains all the information that your executors will need to sort out your estate after

you have gone. It starts with where your will and your Letter of Wishes are - make sure that your loved ones know where the original signed will is.

This document should have:

#### **Your names**

All of them and previous ones. Date of birth, your address, previous addresses you can remember as this can be handy for tracking down some things and your National Insurance number.

#### **Your documents**

Note where your passport, driving licence, disabled badge, railcards, and any membership cards are.

#### Your money

List details of your bank and building society current accounts, savings accounts, investments, premium bonds and if you have cash stored anywhere.

If you have joint accounts, the other person can usually access those after your death.

Also, any shop loyalty cards or air miles as there may be valuable points on them.

If you have a financial adviser who looks after some things for you, give their details here.

#### Your income

List all your pensions including the state pension, other benefits, earnings, self-employment, dividends, interest, annuities, rent, and anything else and say where all the documents are.

#### Creditors

If someone or some firm owes you money, list the full details here. The executors have a duty to recover it.

#### Any debts

What are these and what are the repayments or deadlines? They could be mortgages, loans, catalogues, credit cards, pawn tickets. Lawful debts must be paid from your estate, but if there is not enough to pay them, then they die with you.

#### **Household bills**

List all your utility providers or say where you keep the paperwork of phone bills, council tax, energy bills, water and other utilities.

#### **Property**

Note down homes you own or own jointly and include details of any mortgage or equity release on them. If you are a landlord, list the tenants and the rent agreements and any agent you use. If you are a tenant, your executors need to know where the tenancy agreement is and include the name of the landlord, the agent, your rent, the deposit you paid and which agency holds it. Your executor can recover this deposit, which is yours by law.

#### Your vehicles

List your car, van, caravan, boat, bike, noting where they are and if there are any finance agreements.

#### Your valuable items

Write down what and where they are; such as special pieces of jewellery or collections of memorabilia.

#### Storage

Give details of any storage unit, a safe or a bank safety deposit box you have. Include the access codes or where the keys are. Do not leave your will in one as your executors will not be able to access the box until probate is granted and probate can't be granted until they have the will.

#### **Passwords**

Write down your passwords, especially the ones to your computer and your bank accounts. Passwords written on a piece of paper cannot be hacked so find a hiding place that is unlikely to be found by a burglar. If you have Bitcoin or other cryptocurrency, write down the access code or say where it is stored.

#### Social media accounts

Say what you want to happen to them. Again, leave the passwords.

#### Insurance

Life insurance, including any funeral plan details so they can be claimed. List any other insurance that can now be cancelled.

#### Your pets

Most people don't leave money to their pets in their will so mention them here, including their regular vet, any insurance that should be continued, and who you want to look after them.

#### Any pensions not yet claimed

Sort these out at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/find-pension-contact-details">https://www.gov.uk/find-pension-contact-details</a> and leave details for your executors. Write down details of all your previous employers and when you worked for them to help the search.

#### Your tax affairs

If you have been in business or were self-employed provide details. If you have given away money, property, shares or valuables in the past seven years, list those gifts with dates. If you've made regular gifts out of income, write that down. All this will help your executors know what needs to be included or can be excluded when doing an inheritance tax calculation.

#### **Secret stuff**

Now is the time to write it down as this is the time not to care if anyone finds out. Do you have a secret bank account? A secret flat? A secret box? Print off the document and keep it in a safe place known to your executor. Put it in a sealed envelope labelled 'not to be opened until after my death'. Nobody wants to die. But it's worth making the effort to do it tidily.


## **Buddies Day Centre**

## **Selsey Lifeboat Events**

It is good to hear that **Lifeboat Week** will take place between **Sunday 3rd August and Sunday 10th August**. Make a note of these dates.

In the meantime, **Selsey RNLI** is holding an inaugural **'Seal Dip'** on **Sunday 4th May** to raise vital funds for the lifeboat station by braving a quick sea dip in waters that average 11°C in May.



Hosted at East Beach Green, the event will start at 10.00am, with the first participants taking the plunge from 10.30am. Each participant can enter for £5 and encouraged to raise



sponsorship from friends and family. Fancy dress is optional but encouraged as keen space film fans will notice this is taking place on a special date in the calendar.

After their dip, participants will receive a hot drink. For those not participating, the RNLI pop up shop will be open and there will be entertainment from the Selsey Molls and Selsey Shantymen. Operations permitting there will be a sail past of Selsey Station's Shannon and D-Class lifeboats.

This event is open to adults and children over the age of 12. Participants should arrive for sign in at the registration tent on East Beach Green between 10.00 and 10.30am where they will be given a wristband which must be worn at all times and scanned before and after the dip.

Another event is the **Annual Sponsored** Walk offering and 10 mile routes and entry is free; participants are invited to fundraise for the RNLI.



The Registration Desk at Selsey Lifeboat Station will be open from 8am to 10am with the event closing at 2pm - they encourage participants to register beforehand so they can provide sponsorship forms.
